## One Wei or Another

Earning a name for yourself in science can be a struggle. Imagine how much harder it would be if your name was routinely confused with several others. That often happens to researchers with Asian names, many of which may share the same English transliteration.

To address the issue, the American Physical Society (APS) will let authors with Chinese, Japanese, or Korean names include the Asian spellings (in parentheses after the English equivalent) on papers in the society's journals, including *Physical Review Letters*. An editorial announcing the policy in December noted that at least eight different Chinese names (shown at left) are transcribed as Wei Wang. "I think this is a great way to show that science is an international matter," says Wei Wang (王伟), a particle physicist at the University of Wisconsin, Madison. Adds Wei Wang (王巍), a biophysicist at the University of California, San Diego, "All the journals should do the same thing."






- Encourage the community to push metadata back to update individual's record

## **Joint Statement of Principle** (14 April 2015)

Use of ORCID has many tangible benefits, for our researchers, research institutions, funding agencies and the nation overall. It is proposed that Australia's research sector broadly embrace the use of ORCID as a common researcher identifier. A small working group from the Council of Australian University Librarians (CAUL), the Australasian Research Management Society (ARMS), Universities Australia (UA) and the Australian National Data Service (ANDS) has drafted the following Joint Statement of Principle:

As a matter of principle we:

1. recognise the value of unique researcher identifiers in reducing red tape, increasing efficiency, improving data quality, integrating disparate data, promoting the reuse of data, and enhancing the online presence of Australian research to the global market; and
2. commit to support the use of ORCID as a common researcher identifier.

## NHMRC and ARC Statement on Open Researcher and Contributor ID (ORCID)

April 2015

The National Health and Medical Research Council (NHMRC) and Australian Research Council (ARC) encourage all researchers applying for funding to have an ORCID identifier.

The applicant profile section of NHMRC's Research Grants Management System (RGMS) was changed in 2014 to allow researchers to include their unique identifier (such as ORCID) when updating their CV and Profile, whilst the ARC is currently considering options for the development of a similar capacity within its Research Management System (RMS 2.0). Universities Australia, the Australasian Research Management Society, and the Council of Australian University Librarians have also endorsed a Joint Statement of Principle to adopt (ORCID), and will continue their collaboration with Australian National Data Service, ARC and NHMRC to progress this work.

## Why is the use of ORCID being encouraged by NHMRC & ARC?

The use of ORCID may help streamline research administration and reporting for researchers and administering institutions through:

- Facilitating disambiguation of researchers and research outputs.
- Enabling the linking and reuse of high quality, persistent data (e.g. publications, grants).

- ORCID will be promoted by integrating it with a variety of services and processes, starting with integration into national federated identity management system
- National coordination managed by the Ministry of Education
- Utilize opt-in process: the researcher creates ORCID identifier
- Implement a national connection service between ORCID and institution identifiers
- Obtain national ORCID group membership

- ① **Integrate data fields** for persistent identifiers for people, places, and things into your systems
- ② **Collect** persistent identifiers during transactions (using authenticated login, not typing!) AND use APIs to help autofill forms
- ③ **Incorporate** identifiers into published metadata





- ❖ **Data Governance:** ORCID is committed to maintaining persistence of the ORCID identifier Registry and data in its charge.
- ❖ **Organization Governance:** ORCID is governed by an elected Board of Directors, majority non-profit, drawn from and representative of ORCID member organizations. Governance documents are posted online.
- ❖ **Community Involvement:** ORCID has Steering and Working Groups and an Ambassador program open to the research community.
- ❖ **Staff:** ORCID operations are managed by a full time staff.

- ❖ Individual creates and modifies record using opt-in process
- ❖ Individual can grant access to record (read/write/update privileges) to other trusted individuals or organizations, and can also revoke privileges

#### Airiti

#### CrossRef Metadata Search

#### DataCite search and link

Search the DataCite Metadata Store to find your research datasets, images and other works. Then claim them by adding them to your ORCID profile.

#### Europe PubMed Central

Europe PubMed Central (Europe PMC) contains all of PubMed, 500K records from Agricola that cannot be found in PubMed, 4 million records from Europe PMC, and 1 million records shared with PMC in the USA.

#### ISNI2ORCID search and link

Enables user to search the ISNI records and link them to his ORCID profile as an external identifier.

#### ResearcherID

ResearcherID is a global, multi-disciplinary scholarly research community where members can register for unique identifier, build a profile of their scholarly works, view citation metrics, and search for like-minded researchers.

#### Scopus to ORCID

Import your Identifier, profile and publications. The wizard helps you find the correct Scopus profile and to confirm your publications. 


